*Notes:

Refer means “not music specific, though it impacts our services.” These will probably be referred to general enhancement groups. Quick comment would be appreciated, but is best to avoid bogging down in these.

High impact means these will have an immediate, meaningful impact on music, or these items intersect with future trends in cataloging (e.g., FRBR). Will likely be pursued. (Priorities may change at the meeting.)

Items **without designations** are desirable and need to be placed in priority order. Alternatively, they address real problems but need further discussion to ensure that results would be desirable.
